Background and rationale

To improve access to training opportunities for adults to support them in their skilling, reskilling and upskilling pathways, **there is an increasing need to improve:**

- **the quality of ALE** (Adult Learning and Education) systems (in terms of provisions and methods)
- **the efficiency and equity of the access systems** (including transparency and clarity of information and learners understanding of the opportunities, in terms of training and funding and links with career development and guidance services)
- supporting a **stronger level of attractiveness for any learner** toward the perspective of lifelong learning.

This core need is not yet matched by training opportunities information systems:

- **sufficient, accessible and integrated**
- with **comprehensive and trustworthy information**
- **connected and interoperable**
- and allowing potential **integration across various competences frameworks**

Main objectives

develop and deliver a model and a proof of concept for an integrated information system of the national registries for training opportunities

(focusing on ALE – Adult Learning and Education)

with a methodology based on interoperability, accessibility and inclusiveness also looking at:

- **quality of the ALE provision** (quality assurance, governance framework)
- **relevance of such training opportunities in terms of employability and personal development.**

In particular, the project:

- **will identify, assess, and test relevant existing approaches for European and national registries of training opportunities**
- **will re-adapt them within an integrated model interoperable with the European Learning Model**
- **will apply a strong innovative approach for active participation (bottom-up)**
- **adopting a co-design approach (based on the Design Thinking method) and involving representatives of all the stakeholder's group in the process, also to support adoption and further exploitation in contexts.**

Main actions and approach



Research and needs analysis

research state of play for the deployment of integrated and interoperable National ALE Registries, at theoretical and policy level, as well as for stakeholders needs

System requirements and modelling

define the main system requirements and information models to implement the Registries, to support interoperability among national systems and European systems, through the ELM application as well as other EU based knowledge systems

Prototyping and pilot activities

piloting activities in 4 countries, expanding, evaluating and refining the prototype of the RALExILA frameworks with national project participants

Through 27 co-design workshops for partners and project participants

Main output > RALExILA - Handbook for the National Registries for ALE

- Quality assurance and governance frameworks for ALE (soft frameworks), including general recommendations and concrete approaches and indicators for training and for the accreditation of training providers.
- System model (hard frameworks), including technical document (vocabularies, descriptors, how to use the model), implementation and integration guidelines.
